Ethiopia joins global fight to end cholera epidemics by 2030

August 16, 2019

The Ethiopian government has committed to developing an evidence-based multi-sectoral National Cholera Elimination Plan, in line with strategy "The Ending Cholera: A Global roadmap to 2030". The plan was recently presented to stakeholders during a high-level advocacy meeting on 23 July 2019. The move represents a crucial milestone in the combat against the disease, which remains a major health burden throughout the Horn of Africa.

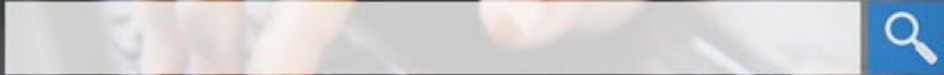
